PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The public session of the meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Luke Leszyk who led the assembled in the pledge of allegiance. Present were Mayor Luke Leszyk, Deputy Mayor Louie Perazzini, Trustee Anthony Fraboni, Trustee Laurie DeNardo, Trustee Nan Woodworth, Sergeant Brandon Matthews, Village Clerk Lonnie Childs and Treasurer Rhonda Slater. Also present were Park Manager Michelle Hyde and Water Supervisor Martin Pierce. Absent was Superintendent of Public Works Terry Wilcox. There were approximately seventeen other persons in attendance.

PUBLIC BE HEARD

Sandra Bartone was present to ensure that the public was aware of what the term MOU stands for - a Memorandum of Understanding - and that it is not as binding as a legal agreement.

Several residents expressed their concerns regarding an article in the paper written by Peter Mantius stating that the Village of Watkins Glen water supply contains excessive levels of PFA'S. The Board commented that the Village does take the matter seriously and will be conducting its own investigations and lab testing. A response to the public will be made once all the facts have been gathered.

Peter Mantius was also present and expressed surprise at the level of concern voiced by some residents to his article and felt the Board was moving in the right direction.

Brad Eakins requested that the Village list the Watkins Glen Housing Authority meetings on the calendar section of the Village website. Currently the Village is only posting the minutes for the Watkins Glen Housing Authority, as they are provided to the Village Office.

BOARD CONCERNS

Village Website Update

Village Clerk Lonnie Childs updated the Board on the meeting with D. Scott regarding the implementation of the new Village website. The new website is expected to go live before the end of the calendar year.

LimeBike Vandalism

Trustee Laurie DeNardo spoke to the public regarding the vandalism done to the LimeBikes that were placed throughout the Village. The company will be removing all the LimeBikes from the Village of Watkins Glen for the rest of the season. It is unknown at this time if they will be returning next year.

Possible MOU with Schuyler County

The Board discussed the possibility of entering into an agreement with Schuyler County to combine efforts to make available the current wastewater treatment plant property and the current Village Marina Bar & Grill area of the Seneca Harbor Park in an attempt to maximize potential future redevelopment of said area once the wastewater treatment plant has been deconstructed. There will be a community meeting on Wednesday, September 11th at 5pm at the Community Center discussing this and various other topics. Mayor Luke Leszyk stated that the residents do not need to worry about Lakefront access as there is a strip all along the waterway that will be open to the public and admittance will not be restricted.

Catholic Charities – Domestic Violence Awareness

The Village Board gave permission for Catholic Charites to place purple ribbons along Franklin Street for domestic violence awareness during the month of October.

NYSDOT Project Update

The Village Board discussed the NYSDOT Franklin Street project. Trustee Laurie DeNardo informed the public that the NYSDOT will change the yellow blinking turning arrow to a green turning arrow at the intersection of Fourth and Franklin Streets on a trial basis. Mayor Luke Leszyk stated that there are now outlets on several key intersections that will allow for generators to be hooked up to keep lights running during a power outage.

Franklin Streetlight Project

Some of the poles have started to come in, however the luminaires and bases have not been delivered yet.

Lakeside Construction 2020

The Board discussed the 2020 Lakeside Construction and how that will affect the rental and use of Clute Park. The plan is to keep the park open during the renovation process as much as possible.

Trustee Laurie DeNardo made the motion to exit public session and enter executive session at 7:06 pm for a personnel issue. Trustee Nan Woodworth seconded the motion and all were in favor. Motion Carried.

Trustee Anthony Fraboni made the motion to extend the provisional appointment of Brandon Matthews until the next Sergeants exam is offered through Civil Service. Trustee Laurie DeNardo seconded the motion. The Board then voted on the motion and all were in favor. Motion Carried.

With no further business to come before the Board, Trustee Anthony Fraboni made the motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:46 pm. Trustee Laurie DeNardo seconded the motion. The Board then voted on the motion and all were in favor. Motion Carried.
